

## Uniform/ Dress Code

### 1.0 Purpose

- Maintaining a professional image promotes a positive attitude towards the group as representatives of Polish culture in South Australia.
- Consistent uniform/ dress code assists with uniformity for planning and organising the intricate choreography.
- The dress code prescribed is required to meet Work Health and Safety Requirements to ensure the safety of members.

### 2.0 Policy Details

- Clothing worn must be clean and in good repair at all times without loose dragging material
- It is an expectation that members will wear a dark blue/ black top or purchase a Tatry top which can be worn with shorts, leggings or track pants
- Long sleeve garments may be worn under the top. Alternatively a dark blue/ black sweater or hooded sweater may be worn
- Long, dangly earrings are not advised to reduce risk of injury when dancing
- Long hair is to be tied securely to reduce risk of injury when dancing
- Sandals and open foot wear are not permitted to reduce risk of injury. For female juniors well-fitting “Mary Jane shoes” (school shoes with a strap over), ballet shoes or jiffies are

- acceptable. Male juniors may wear light sandals or other dance shoes. Shoes that are flexible enough to allow dancers to point their feet are preferable.
- Seniors are to wear well-fitting dance shoes/ ballet shoes/ costume boots. Dance shoes can be better preserved by only wearing them upon arrival at rehearsal.
  - Seniors to be considerate of their partners and wear antiperspirant/ deodorant

### 3.0 Policy Scope

This is a requirement at all rehearsals whether at the home site of Dom Polski or offsite at other festivals /performances. For example but not exclusively including Polart Festival, Dożynki Festival, Multi-Cultural Festival, Wedding Performances, Private events etc.
